Word Reversal - Purposely reversing the order of sentences to create a sense of interest.

Ex. Yoda, Fortune Cookies, William Shakespeare

*** Also called inverted sentences.**

I ate the sandwich.

Sandwich ate I.

The sandwich I ate.

The sandwich ate I.

Archaic Phrases - Old, outdated words that appear in older writings and speech

ex. thee, thou, shan't etc.

Shakespearean Comedy

Comic Relief: Following a tense, emotional, sad or violent scene in a play with a funny scene to lighten the mood.

Shakespearean Comedy

Pun: A comedic play on words that has more than one meaning...

Shakespearean Comedy

Innuendo: Hinting at what is meant without saying it directly... often used with rude, insulting, or sexual comments
*** Involves sarcasm**

**Bawdy Humor: Dirty,
perverted, or sexual jokes...
Sometimes called: "toilet
humor"**
